The recorded data suggests that the lake is currently in excellent condition and that the numbers remain stable year after year. The raw water intake, located just upstream of the dam, suggests no deterioration in water quality.

We are planning a meeting with the various Pontbriand Lake Associations in early 2023.

Finally, still on the subject of major projects, I am pleased to announce that the first phase of the Citizen's Quarter is complete: the new skateboard park is ready. Its official inauguration will be held next spring, with all of those who were involved in the project, young people and sports enthusiasts!

IMPORTANT REMINDERS SNOW REMOVAL

This season, you will be able to consult our website for information regarding up-to-date snow removal operations. For information on provincial roads under the jurisdiction of the MTQ, please call 511 or consult transports.gouv.qc.ca.

To facilitate snow removal and waste pickup (bins), we remind you to always:

- Bring your bins to the curb on the morning of pickup if precipitation is forecast;
- Remove the snow from the bin lids;
- Place your bins at the edge of your property, in your driveway or behind the sidewalk;
- Remove the bins as soon as possible after pickup.

OVERNIGHT PARKING DURING THE WINTER SEASON

From November 1st to April 15th inclusively, from 11 pm to 7 am, it is forbidden to park in the streets. To keep snow removal operations running smoothly, vehicles that are parked illegally or that hinder snow removal will be towed at the owner's expense.

If your vehicle has been towed due to snow removal operations, please call the Sûreté du Québec.

SNOW ON YOUR PROPERTY - TO EACH HIS OWN!

We remind you that it is forbidden to push or blow snow from a private property (courtyard, entrance, parking area, etc.) onto public property (sidewalk, street, ditch, fire hydrant).





A GREEN CHRISTMAS!

GIVE YOUR NATURAL CHRISTMAS TREE A SECOND SHOT

What if your Christmas tree turned out to be practical, in addition to sprucing up your Holidays?

Use it to make a household cleaner! Place a few branches into a pot with white vinegar and let them soak for about 2 weeks. Strain the mixture and pour the vinegar into a spray bottle. A 50/50 solution of vinegar and water will be perfect for washing windows, mirrors and disinfecting the microwave oven!

Use the small branches of your tree to make potpourri. Place them in a jar with citrus or dried fruit, cinnamon sticks or other spices. Pour this mixture into a pot filled with water and simmer for an hour to spice up the air in your home!

Once the festivities are over, you can bring your Christmas tree to the Ecocentre; however, the trunk cannot be more than 10 cm in diameter. A great way to dispose of it. (schedule at rawdon.ca)







FIRE PREVENTION

Did you know that 49% of residential fires are caused by distraction and human error? BEWARE OF HOT ASHES!

To dispose of your ashes safely, you must:

- Empty the ashes from your fireplace regularly, never using a vacuum cleaner, but rather a metal shovel;
- Place the hot ashes in a metal container with a raised bottom and fitted with a metal lid:
- Bring the metal container outside, because hot ashes release carbon monoxide;
- Place it on a non-combustible surface, at least 1 meter away from any object;
- Wait at least 7 days before transferring the ashes from the metal container to another container (garbage can, compost bin) and stir them to make sure that they have completely cooled. If you can, keep the ashes outside all winter and throw them out in the spring.

IMPORTANT – Considering that you use a combustion appliance, make sure you have carbon monoxide detector within five meters of your bedrooms.
