BULKY ITEMS AND HHW

The next bulky items pick-up is scheduled for the weeks of July 4th and August 1st. YOU MUST CALL AHEAD! Contact Compo Recycle no later than the Friday preceding the pick-up, by leaving a message at 450 882.9186, ext. #306.

The Hazardous Household Waste Transfer Centre is open every Friday from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm and from 1 pm to 4 pm (closed on June 24th and July 1st).

A new way to submit a request to the Department of Public Works

Like other municipalities in Quebec, Rawdon is introducing a new way to submit an official request to the Department of Public Works, in order to ensure that a need shared by area residents is met.

Please note that this new way of doing things applies to requests regarding signage, traffic control (speed bumps, pedestrian crossings, bollards, etc.), street lights, speed limits or parking.

Henceforth, any request must:

- Come from a resident/taxpayer from the sector or street concerned;
- **Be submitted in writing** via a form available on our website or at the Town Hall;
- Include a list of signatures from the majority of the residents in the sector affected by the request. Only one signature per household will be considered.

Preventive Inspections of Septic Systems

As mandated by the ministère de l'Environnement et de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques to enforce the regulation concerning the evacuation and treatment of wastewater from isolated residences, and like all other municipalities of Quebec, Rawdon will begin the inspection of certain septic systems.

This summer, the Municipality will inspect about 100 residences located around Rawdon Lake, Regent Lake and Lake Clair. The targeted properties are those that have systems that are several decades old. The property owners will be advised by mail prior to the visits.



We would like to remind you that you must obtain your current year permit to navigate your boat on Pontbriand Lake. It is now available at Cascades Park. Please be mindful of your waves! Before launching your boat, we ask that you read our Responsible Boater's Guide that explains the negative effects that oversized waves have on the environment and safety.

WATERING SCHEDULE

Did you know that the watering schedule was changed last year? Please respect it as it helps to protect this precious resource and avoids waste.

The watering of lawns is permitted from 4 am to 6 am only, if the water is supplied by an automatic sprinkler system or from 8 pm to 10 pm if it is supplied by a mechanical sprinkler system, on the following days:

Wednesdays and Sundays

Buildings with an even civic number

Tuesdays and Saturdays

Building with an odd civic number

For information regarding the watering of other plants, new lawns, or about the filling of swimming pools and spas, please visit the Municipality's website.

REMINDER

In dry weather, it is best to keep your grass at about 7.5 cm (3 in.) in length, as it will retain water better!

Online Services

Your citizen account allows you to access several municipal services in one place! One password, several services!



1. Using your telephone, tablet or personal computer, click on the "online services" tab on the homepage at rawdon.ca. You will be directed to your citizen account. Choose the SIGN-UP option (on the right).*

2. Fill out the personal information fields and place a check mark on the last sentence to also set up your recreation module (even if you do not want to register for an activity right away!).

3. Once your account has been created, a message will prompt you to enter an address in your profile.

4. To access your tax bill(s), you will need to enter, for each of your properties, the account number and 1st instalment amount indicated on the tax bill.

Voilà, you are registered! Now, all you have to do is explore the services offered and to add your family members, if necessary.

moderate

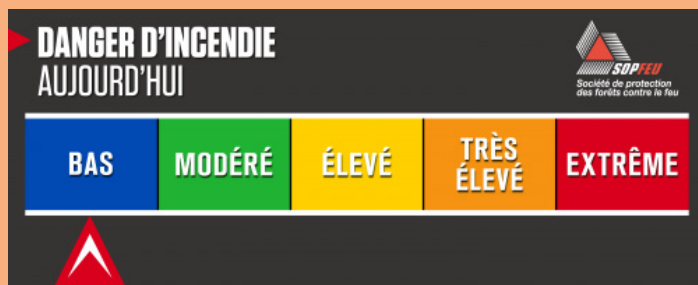
A small fire is permitted.
